acid rain *noun* Rain, snow, or other precipitation that has a high amount of acidity. Acid rain comes from pollution in the air.

acknowledge (ăk nŏl'ij) *verb* **1.** To admit that something exists or is true: *It is hard to acknowledge your mistakes.* **2.** To recognize that someone has authority: *They were acknowledged as experts in chemistry.* **3.** To notice and respond to something: *The leader acknowledged the cheering crowd by waving.*


acknowledgment (ăk nŏl'ij mŏnt) *noun*
1. Something that you write or say to recognize or respond to another person's action: *In her acknowledgments, the author thanked all the people who had helped her.* **2.** The act of admitting that something exists or is true: *I bowed my head in acknowledgment of guilt.*

acne (ăk'nē) *noun* A condition in which the oil glands of the skin become infected and then form pimples.

acorn (ă'kŏrn') *noun* The nut of an oak tree. Acorns have a smooth, hard shell with a scaly cap.

■ **acid rain** The smoke from smokestacks and the exhaust from cars contain chemicals that combine with raindrops in clouds to form acids. The rain falls as acid rain. It kills plants and pollutes lakes and rivers.

acoustic (ə kŏŏ'stik) *adjective* **1.** Having to do with how materials and spaces affect sound: *The singer's voice sounded very clear because of the good acoustic design of the concert hall.* **2.** Making music without using electronic instruments: *Sophia brought an acoustic guitar on the camping trip.*

Spelling Note


bicycle

The prefix *bi-* means "two." Recognizing this prefix will help you spell the word *bicycle* (a vehicle with two wheels) and these other words: *bilingual* (speaking two languages); *binary digit* (one of the two numbers 0 and 1 used in some counting systems); *binoculars* (an optical instrument consisting of two small telescopes); *biplane* (an airplane with two sets of wings); *bisect* (to cut into two equal parts). The word *biscuit* also contains the element *bi-*; it originally meant "twice-baked."

bicycle (bi'sik'əl) *noun* A vehicle with two wheels mounted one behind the other, a seat for the rider, and pedals for turning the wheels. ► *verb* To ride a bicycle.
► *verb forms* bicycled, bicycling

bid (bid) *verb* **1.** To offer an amount of money as a price: *I bid a dollar for the old magazine.* **2.** To say or express something to someone: *Our guests walked to the door, and we bid them farewell.* **3.** To order someone to do something; command: *The knight bade his squire to prepare for the journey.* ► *noun* **1.** An offer to pay or accept a certain amount for something: *We're looking for a higher bid for our boat.* **2.** An amount that is bid: *The winning bid for the necklace was \$500.*
► *verb forms* bid or bade, bid or bidden, bidding

Big Dipper *noun* A group of seven stars in the northern sky that is shaped somewhat like a cup with a long handle, with four stars forming the cup and three forming the handle. It is larger than the Little Dipper, which has a similar shape.

Grade 3–6—A clean layout, quality illustrations, and notes on word histories, synonyms, vocabulary, and spelling—all features of earlier editions—have been retained in this edition. The lexicon contains 25,000

words and 1500 full-color illustrations. Entries are highlighted in blue followed by the pronunciation, part of speech, and definition(s). Plural forms, verb forms, and variant spellings are noted.
